Multimodal Feasibility Study



Join us for a Project Steering Committee Meeting #3 on Monday, March 9, 2026!

The Lee County Metropolitan Planning Organization invites you to participate in the third Project Steering Committee (PSC) meeting for the Caloosahatchee Downtown Alternative Multimodal Feasibility Study (Feasibility Study). During this meeting the consultant team will describe the Recommended “Preferred Alternative” and how the proposed SUN Trail bike ped shared-use path alignment will connect and travel to and through downtown Fort Myers both from the south and north. The team will also describe how the SUN Trail alternative will traverse north of the River to Cape Coral. The team will also describe public comments from the February 24, 2026 public information meeting and remaining work to complete the plan.

The Feasibility Study is evaluating corridors to build a shared-use path from John Yarbrough Linear Park Trail in Fort Myers to Littleton Road in North Fort Myers using the new eight-foot-wide sidewalk on the Caloosahatchee Bridge. The Feasibility Study will identify on-road and off-road trail alternatives, which are specific locations for a shared-use path along the corridor. The Feasibility Study will recommend a preferred alternative based on a detailed evaluation. This project is expected to become part of the Florida Department of Transportation’s Shared-Use Non-motorized (SUN) Trail network. The project also evaluates safety, accessibility, environmental and land use impacts, right-of-way needs, costs, and community and business considerations, and includes an implementation strategy aligned with available funding.

The third PSC is set to take place on Monday, March 9, from 1:30 PM to 3 PM. This meeting will be held at the Collaboratory, located at 2031 Jackson Street, Fort Myers, Florida 33901. Please respond by March 2 regarding your participation. If you cannot attend, please provide an alternate representative from your organization for our PSC meetings.
